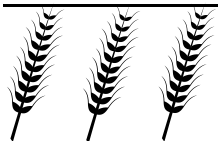


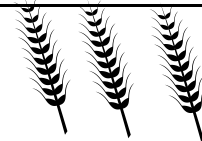

Computer-Dealt Hands Truly Random or Impishly Fixed? - copied from ACBL website

Computer-generated hands have a bad reputation in some circles — undeservedly so. "These computer hands!" is a common cry, but how different are "computer hands" from people-dealt hands? Also, how does ACBL create these deals?

Let's tackle the second question first. It is a simple matter for a computer to deal a set of 52 cards. To explain how this process works, using an oversimplified analogy, consider how a mailman places letters in a set of post office boxes. Each piece of mail has an address, and the mailman places each piece in the correct box. Similarly, each card of the deck is randomly assigned a value which determines which "box" (hand) it will be dealt to. There is a catch, however, and it has to do with the word "randomly." It is important that the computer performs this task in a random fashion. Otherwise there is a risk that the same set of hands will be generated more than once. Many computers use their internal clocks as a "random" starting value to assign each of the cards an "address." In

practice, however, this method isn't sufficiently random enough. The software that ACBL uses to generate deals, therefore, requires an additional step. The staff person whose job it is to create the deals must physically deal out a set of 52 cards, just as you would do at the bridge table. The four hands are entered into the computer. This information, along with the time at which it was entered, create the starting value for the process and ensures that it is completely random. For the more technically inclined, the random number generator uses a linear congruential algorithm that will repeat after 2 to the 47th power (140,737,488,355,328) deals have been generated.

Returning to the question of whether computer-dealt hands are different from people-dealt ones, remember the great emphasis placed on creating a random deal. To create a random deal manually, players must give the deck a thorough shuffle at least seven times to guarantee that the cards are mixed. It is common, however, to see players shuffle the deck only two or three times before dealing. This is not a random deal. Although it is beyond the scope of this article to demonstrate, it has been suggested by various mathematical authorities that this inadequate shuffling may lead to "flatter" distributions. In other words, suits may break evenly more often than expected. Players who are accustomed to their trump suits dividing evenly all the time because of inadequate mixing seem genuinely offended when they encounter a 4--1 trump split in a computer-dealt game, even though that division will occur 28% of the time. "Computer-dealt hands!" they mutter, but in reality they're just getting a dose of a truly random deal. Another factor which causes some players to believe that computer-dealt hands are different from people-dealt ones is that hand records are usually available after a computer-dealt session. Players then have the opportunity to see all the cards of every deal, and some of these

players will use the hand records as "proof" of the "strange distributions" supposedly caused by the computer. If these same players could see hand records from their local club games, they would find that "strange distributions" occur in hand-dealt games as well.

Does anyone at ACBL look at the deals in order to throw out "boring" ones or to include particularly frustrating ones? Never. Repeat: Never. In fact, only two people at ACBL are even permitted to see the hand records. One is the person whose job it is to set up the computer to generate the hand records. The other is the print shop manager who cuts, wraps and labels the hand-record packages. Neither is a bridge player. The hand records are then sealed and shipped to the ACBL warehouse. When needed, they are mailed to the tournament official who orders them. No one at ACBL ever manipulates the deals.

Sometimes players complain that the cards seem to run one direction (usually the direction of their opponents). "North-South had all the cards!" This does occur sometimes, but it happens in people-dealt games as well. George S. Kaufman, the famous New York dramatist and bridge expert, once quipped that clubs should post which way the cards are running as a courtesy to the players. He said this, however, during the 1930s. People have been complaining that their opponents hold all the cards since the days of whist.

Finally, let's not forget the advantages of computer dealing. At NABC+ events, the duplimate machine actually pre-deals several sections of hands based on computer records. Without computers, hand records would not be available at tournaments. It would be too time-consuming to copy all of the information from people-dealt hands.

Message from the Game Management Committee

As reported at the AGM in June table counts were down in 2003/2004 and we operated at a deficit. Not much is needed to reverse this trend - in fact we only need to increase table count by 4% to break even on the year.

What this actually mean? Well it means that in the 2004/2005 season we need to increase our total table count by about 106 tables - or 9 tables more each month. Nine tables a month translates into 36 people playing one extra time in the month. With over 200 members in our club, this means that if each person played three extra games over the course of the year - we would break even. If each person played 4 more times a year than they did in 2003/2004 we should comfortably be able to handle any increase in costs. This seems like very little to ask of our membership. Let's all take the challenge and commit to this small measure to help maintain the club.

In an effort to help our players enjoy these extra visits to the club the current executive is planning on having more "party" nights this year. These will be games were players are asked to bring either food or door prizes and we will all enjoy the special fun these nights are and we will help keep the "wolf from the door".

Once again we are getting into the swing of all the year's bridge events. Many events begin in the fall at the club and conclude with Canadian National Finals or ACBL Wide Finals in the spring. Please check the Club Bulletin board for complete details on all events.

With the fall season just getting under way and the club anxious to increase table counts I thought it would be a good idea to review some of the "Rules of Etiquette" for bridge.

Bridge Table Etiquette

- from *Play Bridge*

North:

Make certain you have the right boards.
Make certain they are turned the correct direction.
Move the boards consistent with movement directions.
At the completion of the last round:
Turn a "North" card upside down
Return boards to the book shelf
Stack boards sequentially and neatly

South:

Greet your opponents.
Keep your table neat and clean.
At the completion of the last round:
Leave the table neat and clean
Straighten the table, chairs and snack tables.

East/West:

Greet your hosts
If you brought something (drink, food, trash) to the table, take it away when you leave.
At the completion of the last round:
Take final travelers to the director for scoring
Help South straighten the table, chairs and snack tables.

Bridge Etiquette

All bridge players, but especially more experienced players, should provide an example of good bridge etiquette for others to emulate. Here is a list of etiquette guidelines:

- ★ Be courteous to your partner and opponents at all times.
- ★ Avoid remarks or actions that might annoy or embarrass another player.
- ★ When necessary, a call for the director should be made in a manner that is courteous to the players and to the director.
- ★ Don't take offense at inadvertent or ignorant breaches of etiquette by other players, especially inexperienced ones.
- ★ Maintain a pleasant demeanor.
- ★ Refrain from unnecessary talking during a hand or between the boards of a round.
- ★ Be a good sport. Compliment your partner or the opponents when it is deserved.
- ★ Avoid gloating after a good result.
- ★ Avoid griping after a bad result.
- ★ Abide by the director's decisions with graciousness.

Good bridge etiquette will make you a popular player. Other players will applaud your successes and commiserate with you in your failures. Bad bridge manners result in an atmosphere of hostility. When such a player does well, an air of suspicion and detachment surrounds him. Regardless of his ability and results, he will eventually run out of partners and teammates. It is in every player's self-interest to develop good bridge etiquette.

It's not enough to win the tricks that belong to you. Try also for some that belong to the opponents..Alfred Sheinwold

DICK'S DELPHI

One evening, while
playing on the net,

Larry McCormick held the following
hand:

♠ KQx
♥ AJ10xxxx
♦ xx
♣ x

The dealer, on Larry's right,
opened 3C. Larry felt that it would be
a sin not to be able to show this hand
in some way even though, in direct
seat, he lacked sufficient values for a
constructive bid. Larry was afraid of
3C begin passed out when who knows
what he and his partner could make.

This hand poses a good question in
regards to technique and tactics after a
pre-empt. Pre-empts make life
miserable, as we know, as they use up
a lot of exploratory bidding room. It
is often necessary to make an
"intelligent" evaluation of your hand
and to take precipitous action on
occasion.

I prefer 4 Hearts on this hand. To
me it says, "I have a pretty good shot
at making it pard." You provide me
with one or two tricks and then the
one I hope the defence will give me,
should give me the contract.
Occasionally I may only need the one
from the defence!! To me a 3H bid
would show a different hand. There
would be less distribution but likely
more high card. A possible example
may be:

♠ AJx
♥ AKQxx
♦ AJx
♣ xx

OR

♠ AQx
♥ AKxxxx
♦ KJ
♣ xx

I would expect partner to raise to 4H
with a few cards which look useful.

Remember - the opponents have to
find their four tricks before you find
your 10. This is often not easy!!

Another reader submitted the
following. Vulnerable against Non-
Vulnerable I held the following hand:

♠ Void
♥ AKQJxxxx
♦ xx
♣ QJ

The Bidding proceeded as follows:

ME	OPP	PARD	OPP
2C ¹	2S	3S ²	P
4H	4S	DBL	P
4NT ³	P	5D	P
5H	P	P	P

¹ strong, artificial opener

² says 7 - 9 high card points

³ Blackwood

My Partner's hand was:

♠ AJx
♥ x
♦ Q10xx
♣ 97xxx

The opps cashed the Ace of Cs and
then switched to the King of Spades.
This allowed me to discard and I only
went down one. At other tables many
in 5H were down two doubled.

Question: *Should I open 1H or 2C or
4H or what? How high should I
compete based on the competition?
Are there other ways we could have
bid to better describe our hands?*

Long suits often lead to interesting
or even bizarre results. No system has
tools to handle 9 card suits. Since
your hand has only four losers, it fits
one definition for a two club opening
bid (ie. 9+ tricks), but falls far short of
the defensive strength two club
openers usually imply. I would prefer
a sneak attack. If you open 1H and
then bid 2H over whatever they bid,
then 3H - you could buy the contract
at 4H. If they arrive in 4S, after both
opponents bid or support spades, you
should maybe quit since the
vulnerability doesn't make the 5 level
very attractive. If partner had a
minor suit ace, rather than the spade
Ace, the 5 level can still be a good
"save"!

Generally, these hands require good
guessing and even better luck! As a
general approach, opening one of your
very long suit and then bidding

to the 5 level will often taunt your opponents into doing something foolish. Any plus looks good, especially +790 or +850!!
