## Presidents Message

There are games on Tuesday, December 26 and I remind you that the evening game is a team game (CNTC Club Qualifying—see the bulletin board for more information). Thanks to our troop of directors (and those who help out when our regularly-scheduled directors are unavailable) we have games for you during the holiday season. Have fun!

Secondly, thanks to all who helped with the Fall Sectional. We realized a profit (see the minutes posted at the club). It must have been enjoyable as the table counts in the following week were quite decent. I hope you were able to take home some extra points during the rest the October Club Appreciation month. Check out the website (under Game Results) to see how you—and the opponents fared. On my last visit to the website I noticed that June is leading the Player of the Year race (but Art is really close) and Bev Skulmoski leads the Under 100's.

At the most recent board meetings we have had concerns raised by members about inconsistencies in play at the table. In the previous newsletter Dick's submission talked about Standard Discards expected in Duplicate Bridge. Since then we have had members raise concerns about the use of the Stop Card. If you are unsure as to its use please ask any director or your Wednesday night mentorship partner. Another concern raised was that of the role of the dummy. The dummy says nothing, the dummy keeps hands off the table until a card is called for by the declarer and the dummy does not prompt declarer in any way—not even to indicate whether declarer is in hand or on board. Dummy may only try to prevent declarer from leading from the wrong hand if he/she sees that declarer is about to play a card from hand while on the board, or about to call a card from dummy when in hand. Before that happens, dummy can do nothing. This last bit was news to me. It seems that the dummy is exactly that: a dummy. Thank you to members for raising these concerns. If you are an experienced player, please help out by answering questions the newer ones have. If you are a newer player, please feel free to ask questions or call the director (remember: "*director, please*"). If you are an in-between player, hang in there—there's a lot to learn. Above all, keep in mind that the game is meant to be fun and without opponents there is no game.

In closing, I hope those of you who have taken lessons have learned much. I hope those of you who direct have received thanks from players. I hope those who provide food have been thanked. I encourage those who come out on Wednesday night for the club mentorship game to tell others that much can be learned there. Finally, thank you to the group of people who work with me on the board of directors for being involved and concerned with the future of the club.

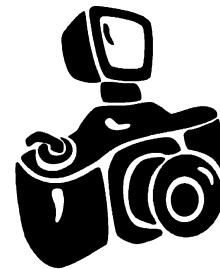
### **If Santa gave you what you wanted...**
