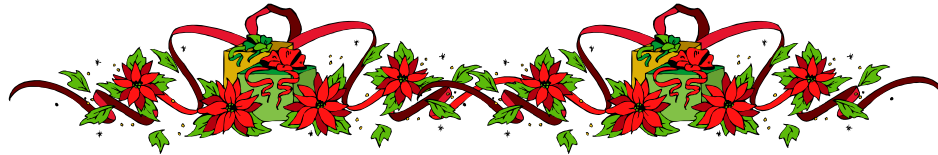

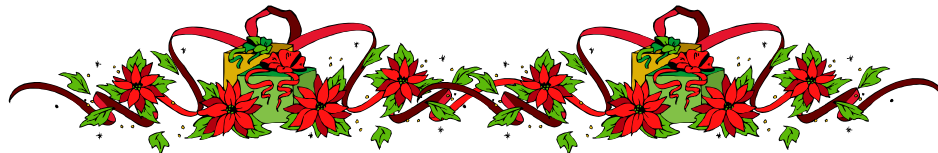


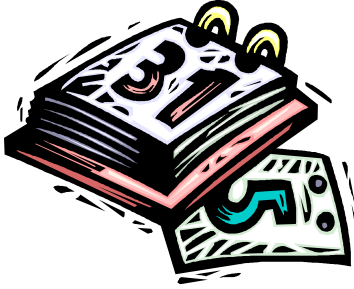

**As we all go through our personal day-to-day lives, you may know someone who could donate a really great gift for the party. Please solicit on behalf of the Club – you might win it!**

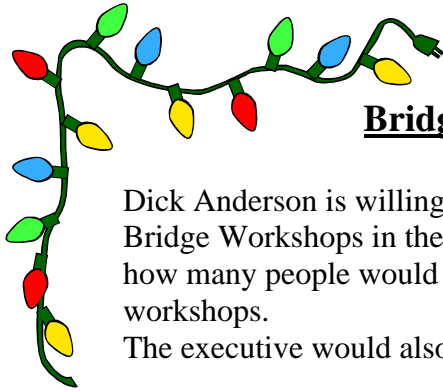
**Wall of Life Masters**
